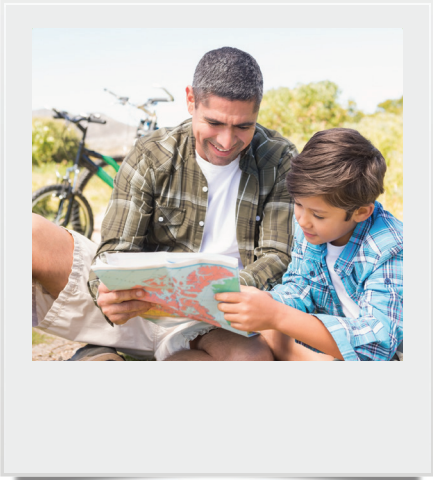

- Sign up to receive Alerts for other locations, like a camp or elderly parent's home.
- You'll receive an Alert when your power is restored.

Spring energy-saving ideas

- During the spring months before it gets too hot outside, open up your blinds and curtains to let natural light help you use your indoor lighting more efficiently.
- When it's hot outside, close your blinds and drapes during the day to block the heat of direct sunlight.
- Use a microwave, stovetop or outside grill to cook, instead of cooking or baking indoors that produces heat.
- Dry clothes on clothes lines instead of using your clothes dryer.
- Turn off computers or other electronic equipment and get outside!

We are committed to sound environmental policies and practices

We conduct our business and facility operations in a manner that minimizes adverse environmental impacts on present and future generations. One of our goals is to reduce the amount of Carbon Dioxide (CO2) released into the atmosphere as a result of generating electricity. You can help us with this goal by participating in our **NY Wind Energy** program.

The electricity we purchase is generated using many different fuel sources. We are required by the New York State Public Service Commission (PSC) to publish an environmental disclosure on the electricity fuel mix twice a year with the most recent data provided by the PSC, in this case for calendar year 2013.

If you buy your electricity supply from NYSEG:

- The majority of the electricity supply we deliver to you is purchased in the competitive market. The supply price varies each month as the market price of electricity fluctuates. We make no profit on the supply charge.

If you buy your electricity supply from a supplier other than NYSEG, and:

- Your supplier's charges are included in your NYSEG bill, your supplier's environmental disclosure will be provided in a separate bill insert in a future NYSEG bill.
- Are billed directly by your supplier, you'll receive environmental disclosure information from your supplier.

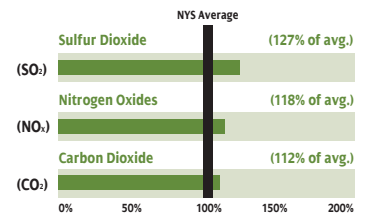
Fuel Sources Used to Generate Your Electricity
